# Hi Andre

I am not sure if this info is too late or not, so apologies if it is. There is no awareness of this regulator in the ER team and as a result we haven't referred any matters to them. There is no MOU that I'm aware of and none of the Assistant Directors in my team are aware of one either. A quick look of matters that are unallocated shows that there are approximately 5 matters that relate to childcare services, so the volume of complaints is likely smaller than any of the existing EDRs.

It would be great to have an MOU/process in place to refer the matters to NECS given their role. The process would likely be similar to those already in place and would enable us to decline on the basis that its better dealt with by them. I am not sure if that leaves an option to come back to the OAIC or not like the EDRs do?





It established the uniform National Quality Framework for Early Childhood Education and Care, the implementation of which is the responsibility of regulatory authorities in each state and territory (generally located in the relevant department responsible for education) supported by the Australian Children's Education & Care Quality Authority (ACECQA), an independent Commonwealth body. The regulatory authorities are responsible for granting service provider approvals, carrying out the quality assessment and rating of services, and ensuring services meet the requirements of the National Quality Framework.

Under the national law, ACEQQA and the regulatory authorities are subject to the Commonwealth *Freedom of Information Act 1982* and the *Privacy Act 1988*. The <u>Education and Care Services</u> <u>National Regulations</u> modify the FOI Act and Privacy Act in various ways, including to provide that references to the Information Commissioner in those Acts are taken to be references to the National Education and Care Services Freedom of Information Commissioner and the National Education and Care Services Privacy Commissioner. The regulations also provide for appointment to those positions. Under current arrangements, the Education Ministers Meeting (comprising Commonwealth, State and Territory Education Ministers) make the appointments and is the body to whom we report.

I have been appointed as the NECS FOI Commissioner and my colleague, Jackie Wilson, has been appointed as the NECS Privacy Commissioner. We were appointed from 1 January 2024 for a period of 3 years. The appointments are part time, 2 days per week.

We would very much welcome the opportunity to meet with the Commissioners and other relevant OAIC staff to introduce our roles and discuss areas of mutual interest.

As you know, I am based in Sydney. Jackie is based in Canberra but, depending on the timing, may be able to come to Sydney for a meeting. 

As such, it appears the Agency has not utilised the initial processing period effectively and I cannot find that the processing period was insufficient on the basis of complexity or volume.

- 4. Under s 54D(4) I have decided to grant the Agency further time to deal with the internal review request to << Extension Date>>. My reasons are outlined below.
- 5. - 9. [If relevant] On [consultation letter date], the Office of the Australian Information Commissioner (OAIC) consulted with the Applicant to seek their views on the Agency's application. [If response] The Applicant responded to our enquiries and provided comments which I have taken into consideration. # **Reasons for decision**

- 10. Subsection 54D(4) of the FOI Act provides that I may allow further time that I consider appropriate for the Agency or Minister to deal with the request.
- In making my decision under s 54D(4), I have considered the information provided by the Agency, [if relevant] the applicant's views on the application, and the FOI Guidelines issued by the Information Commissioner under s 93A of the FOI Act, in particular paragraphs [3.150] – [3.157].
- 12. On the information before the OAIC, I am satisfied that the application for further time until <<**Extension Date>>** is justified, for the following reasons:
  - [If complex or challenging] Based on the Agency's submissions, I am satisfied that the internal review request involves some challenges for the Agency, based on [the volume of additional relevant potentially relevant documents located during the internal review, the sensitive nature of the documents requested/ the range of documents captured by the request/ challenges involved in the search and retrieval of any relevant documents/ absence of key decision-making personnel/ difficulties incurred in obtaining timely responses from business areas or consulted third parties/ the requirement to obtain subject matter expertise from relevant business line areas in relation to any potential sensitivities involved, etc.].
  - [If voluminous] Based on the Agency's submissions that the Applicant's request captures approximately XXX [documents/pages], I am satisfied the request is [also] voluminous in nature.
  - Granting this extension may avoid the need for the applicant to lodge an application for Information Commissioner review (IC review). As such, I consider that granting this extension of time assists in facilitating and promoting the objects of the FOI Act, as well as providing the applicant with access to the full review mechanisms available under the FOI Act, which would otherwise not be available if the internal review decision remained a deemed affirmation of the original decision.<sup>1</sup>
  - Granting this extension of time is expected to provide the internal review applicant with an internal review decision by the agency by <<Extension Date>>, which will be substantially sooner than a decision in an Information Commissioner review (IC review).

- [if applicant does not object to the extension] The applicant has advised the OAIC that they have no objections of the further time sought by the Agency.
- [If related to extension sought or total processing time] The further time sought by the Agency does not appear to be excessive in the circumstances.
- 13. [Optional, if applicant objections raised] While I have considered the Applicant's objections, including their submissions that [summarise reasons], I am satisfied that this application for further time remains justified for the reasons outlined above.
- 14. In granting this further time, I have also considered:
  - The work already undertaken by the Agency to finalise the request
  - Measures taken by the Agency to ensure a decision is made within the extended time period
  - Steps taken by the Agency to keep the Applicant informed of progress
- The new due date for the Agency's internal review decision is now << Extension Date>>.
- 16. This further time granted under s 54D of the FOI Act means that the deemed affirmation is taken never to have applied if the agency makes a decision on the internal review request by <<Extension Date>>. Such an extension can only be granted once and cannot be extended by a variation.
- 17. If the Agency does not provide the applicant a decision by <<Extension Date>>, or the applicant disagrees with a decision from the agency, it will be open to the applicant to seek Information Commissioner review (IC review). Further information on <u>applying</u> <u>for IC review</u> is available on the OAIC <u>website</u>. Any application for IC review would need to be made within 60 days of the agency's decision or deemed affirmation.

# **Review rights**

If you disagree with the Office of the Australian Information Commissioner's (OAIC) decision you can apply to the Federal Court of Australia or the Federal Circuit Court for a review of a decision of the Information Commissioner, if you think that a decision by the Information Commissioner to grant an extension of time is not legally correct. You can make this application under the *Administrative Decisions* (Judicial Review) Act 1977.

The Court will not review the merits of your case, but it may refer the matter back to the Information Commissioner for further consideration if it finds the decision was wrong in law or the Information Commissioner's powers were not exercised properly.

An application for review must be made to the Court within 28 days of the OAIC sending the decision to you. You may wish to seek legal advice as the process can involve fees and costs. You can make this application under the Administrative Decisions (Judicial Review) Act 1977. The Court will not review the merits of your case but it may refer the matter back to the Information Commissioner for further consideration if it finds the decision was wrong in law or the Information Commissioner's powers were not exercised properly.

An application for review must be made to the Court within 28 days of the OAIC sending the decision to you. You may wish to seek legal advice as the process can involve fees and costs. ## Making a complaint to the Commonwealth Ombudsman

Lovely to hear from you!

On extensions of time to lodge an IC review – the bulk of the applications for extensions that we receive relate to review of deemed access refusal decisions, where the applicant has not received a decision from the agency. The majority of these applications are granted as many applicants are not really aware of or provided their review rights, which may contribute to the length of time to seek review.

In deciding these, we normally consider:

- the length of the delay in applying for IC review
- the reason for the delay
- · any action taken by the applicant regarding the decision after the agency or minister made their decision
- · any prejudice to the agency or the minister and the general public due to the delay and
- the merits of the substantive IC review application.

This is detailed in the direction issues to applicants: <u>Direction as to certain procedures to be followed by applicants in</u> <u>Information Commissioner reviews | OAIC</u>. We also have some basic information in our FOI Guidelines: <u>Part 10: Review</u> <u>by the Information Commissioner | OAIC</u>.

In considering the merits, we don't request the documents at issue. We also don't publish decisions on extension of time decisions, only our s 55K decisions are published.

For extensions of time applications where the applicant did receive a decision, we rely on the statement of reasons and submissions from the parties, weighed against the factors listed above.

Also, we have an Extension of time webinar on next week (Tuesday 10 September) that the team is delivering – it is mainly geared towards the extensions for processing (rather than IC reviews). Please let me know if you are

interested and I can put you in touch with the registrations team!

Regarding Toni – yes, Toni has been appointed for a period of 12 months from 16 August 2024.

# Make a Complaint to the Privacy Commissioner

The National Education and Care Services Privacy Commissioner can investigate complaints from individuals about the Australian Children's Education and Care Quality Authority (ACECQA) and State and Territory Education and Care Services Regulatory Authorities under the Commonwealth *Privacy Act 1988*. You can complain to the Commissioner if you believe ACECQA or a State or Territory Regulatory Authority has interfered with your privacy by breaching an Australian Privacy Principle in relation to your personal information. Personal information is any information that is about an individual and can reasonably identify that individual.

Complaints to the Commissioner must be made in writing. Your complaint should include:

- the name of the agency you are complaining about ie ACECQA or a State or Territory Regulatory Authority
- a brief description of your privacy concern
- any action the agency has taken to address the concern
- copies of any relevant documents, including copies of your complaint to the agency, if any, and its response.

Note: Where there has been an alleged interference with the privacy of a number of individuals, one individual may make a complaint on behalf of the group. This is called a 'representative complaint'. To make a representative complaint, the individual does not need the consent of the group members. I'm writing to follow up on the conversation we had before Easter about arranging a meeting with the OAIC Commissioners.

By way of background, early childhood services in Australia are regulated under an applied national law scheme, the <u>Education</u> and <u>Care Services National Law</u>, that commenced in 2012. It established the uniform National Quality Framework for Early Childhood Education and Care, the implementation of which is the responsibility of regulatory authorities in each state and territory (generally located in the relevant department responsible for education) supported by the Australian Children's Education & Care Quality Authority (ACECQA), an independent Commonwealth body. The regulatory authorities are responsible for granting service provider approvals, carrying out the quality assessment and rating of services, and ensuring services meet the requirements of the National Quality Framework.

Under the national law, ACEQQA and the regulatory authorities are subject to the Commonwealth *Freedom of Information Act 1982* and the *Privacy Act 1988*. The *Education and Care Services National Regulations* modify the FOI Act and Privacy Act in various ways, including to provide that references to the Information Commissioner in those Acts are taken to be references to the National Education and Care Services Freedom of Information Commissioner and the National Education and Care Services Privacy Commissioner. The regulations also provide for appointment to those positions. Under current arrangements, the Education Ministers Meeting (comprising Commonwealth, State and Territory Education Ministers) make the appointments and is the body to whom we report.

I have been appointed as the NECS FOI Commissioner and my colleague, Jackie Wilson, has been appointed as the NECS Privacy Commissioner. We were appointed from 1 January 2024 for a period of 3 years. The appointments are part time, 2 days per week.

We would very much welcome the opportunity to meet with the Commissioners and other relevant OAIC staff to introduce our roles and discuss areas of mutual interest.

As you know, I am based in Sydney. Jackie is based in Canberra but, depending on the timing, may be able to come to Sydney for a meeting. Perhaps we can look to arrange a time in late April or early May. You might be best placed to identify some possible dates but let me know if you think there would be a better way to try to identify a suitable date.



It established the uniform National Quality Framework for Early Childhood Education and Care, the implementation of which is the responsibility of regulatory authorities in each state and territory (generally located in the relevant department responsible for education) supported by the Australian Children's Education & Care Quality Authority (ACECQA), an independent Commonwealth body. The regulatory authorities are responsible for granting service provider approvals, carrying out the quality assessment and rating of services, and ensuring services meet the requirements of the National Quality Framework.

Under the national law, ACEQQA and the regulatory authorities are subject to the Commonwealth *Freedom of Information Act 1982* and the *Privacy Act 1988*. The regulations also provide for appointment to those positions. Under current arrangements, the Education Ministers Meeting (comprising Commonwealth, State and Territory Education Ministers) make the appointments and is the body to whom we report.

I have been appointed as the NECS FOI Commissioner and my colleague, Jackie Wilson, has been appointed as the NECS Privacy Commissioner. We were appointed from 1 January 2024 for a period of 3 years. The appointments are part time, 2 days per week.

We would very much welcome the opportunity to meet with the Commissioners and other relevant OAIC staff to introduce our roles and discuss areas of mutual interest.

As you know, I am based in Sydney. Jackie is based in Canberra but, depending on the timing, may be able to come to Sydney for a meeting. ### Extension of time request under s 54T of the FOI Act

I refer to your request for an extension of time (s 54T) to seek Information Commissioner review (IC review) of the decision deemed to be made by the [Agency name] under the *Freedom of Information Act* 1982 (the FOI Act).

As noted in our previous correspondence to you inviting your application for extension under s 54T [OR As noted in your application for IC review], your IC review application was received outside of the prescribed statutory timeframe. As a delegate of the Information Commissioner, I am authorised to make decisions on requests for extensions of time under s 54T of the FOI Act.

#### **Judicial review**

If you disagree with the OAIC's decision you can apply to the Federal Court of Australia or the Federal Circuit Court for a review of a decision of the Information Commissioner if you think that a decision by the Information Commissioner to grant an extension of time is not legally correct. You can make this application under the Administrative Decisions (Judicial Review) Act 1977. The Court will not review the merits of your case but it may refer the matter back to the Information Commissioner for further consideration if it finds the decision was wrong in law or the Information Commissioner's powers were not exercised properly.

An application for review must be made to the Court within 28 days of the OAIC sending the decision to you. You may wish to seek legal advice as the process can involve fees and costs. Please contact the Federal Court registry in your state or territory for more information, or visit the Federal Court website at <a href="http://www.fedcourt.gov.au/">http://www.fedcourt.gov.au/</a>.

#### Making a complaint to the Commonwealth Ombudsman
